Natural Area Pre-Approved Plants List

Areas of a Lot which are beyond the Transition Zone boundary are defined as the Natural Area. The Natural Area is to remain in its natural state, for the most part. Any plants planted in the Natural Area must be chosen from the Natural Area Pre-Approved Plants List. Planting in the Natural Area shall generally be limited to planting required to replace vegetation that is damaged or destroyed in construction, has died, or for screening and erosion control purposes. Native junipers and pinons planted in the Natural Area should be planted in natural patterns, not in straight rows.
